After 10 months, 17 service requests and numerous emails to the City Council, 6 times hiring a sludge pump for the weekend, multiple times of sweeping and mopping the waste water from areas of the building, and many tears of hope and despair later...: we finally managed to reconnect Ikhaya Labantu's sewer pipework to the Council drains at the beginning of October, and upgrade it at the same time.
