Facility Upgrade Plan

The Board has embarked on an ambitious plan to upgrade the Ikhaya Labantu facilities. We received a substantial injection of funds earlier in the year, which are being channeled towards upgrading the buildings and bringing them closer to the standards which we aspire to. Thus far, we have replaced a solar water panel, to ensure that the residents have access to warm water. Currently, our electrical system is being upgraded to a point of full compliance. These projects will also have the long term benefit of a lowering our electricity bill. - Such important milestones to end the year on a high on!
